Study Session September 13, 2005

❖ **Issaquah Highlands Development**

Judd Kirk, Representing Port Blakely Development Company gave an overview of the Issaquah Highlands Development.

❖ **Beaver Lake Management District Formation**

Senior Planner Evan Holm gave the staff report on the renewal of the Beaver Lake Management District. The process takes about seven months to complete and requires a vote of the residents living in the district.

❖ **Update: East Lake Sammamish Parkway Project**

Senior Transportation Engineer Jeff Brauns and Peter DeBoldt from Pertect Engineering updated the Council on the public process that has taken place to develop the design for improving the parkway. Four concepts were presented. (PowerPoint presentation is available upon request.)

❖ **Neighborhood Traffic Management Pilot Project**

City Engineer Steve Hartwig gave the staff report. Five pilot programs are in the process of being completed. They are located at (1) 205th Place NE (NE 37th Way to 206th Place NE) (2) NE 14th Street (228th Avenue NE to 233rd Avenue NE) (3) 230th Way SE/SE 42nd Street (Issaquah Pine Lake Road to SE 44th Street) (4) SE 32nd Street (244th Avenue SE to 228th Avenue SE) and (5) SE 30th Street (244th Avenue SE to 252nd Avenue SE).

❖ **Update 248th Avenue SE**

Mr. Hartwig gave an update on what might be done to slow the traffic along 248th given the increase in traffic that is expected from future development.

❖ **Council Rules of Procedure**

Council discussed their rules of procedure and made some suggested changes to be considered at the next regular meeting.
